Our Infrastructure

Lead Water Pipe Replacement Protecting our health.

Jim is fighting for the Province to contact all home and property owners in Manitoba with lead water pipes connecting to the city or municipal watermain line and provide full financial support for lead water pipe replacement, so their access to clean water is assured and exposure to lead and its health risks are eliminated.

Elmwood has 2,755 homes requiring lead water pipe replacement.

Separating our Sewer System Protecting our property & environment.

Jim is fighting for all three levels of government to separate our Combined Sewer system. The City needs the support of the Province and Federal Government if Winnipeg homeowners are going to be protected from sewer backup, and help address the environmental damage caused by phosphorous accumulating in Lake Winnipeg.

The Province helps the City with street renewal project funds and the City’s engineers prioritize the streets looking at the street’s sewer lines so it can separate our outdated sewer system. They do two things at once to save taxpayer’s money.

The Louise Bridge appears to be on track for replacement, finally. However, time is running out. We must keep the old bridge open during construction, otherwise 27,000 vehicles per day will have to use alternate routes, including Henderson Hwy. And that’s why the Louise Bridge replacement needs to happen now.

Jim will keep the pressure on, just like he did on the Disraeli, when the City wanted to close the bridge completely for a year and a half and just repair the old structure.

On Consumer Protection

Right to Repair

Protecting consumers, the repair industry, & the environment.

Jim has championed Right to Repair in the Manitoba Legislature by introducing Private Member's Bills dealing with manufacturers of electronic appliances, smartphones, computers, and farm machinery.

Right to Repair is a consumers movement sweeping the European Union and the US requiring manufacturers to make products that are **easy to repair, repairable at a reasonable cost, and built to last a minimum of 10 years.**

Right to Repair also fosters **sustainability** by requiring manufacturers to make information, parts, and tools necessary for repairs available to independent repair shops at a reasonable price.

It's also a giant step forward in reducing the 757,000 tonnes of electronic waste produced in Canada.



When the current PC Government tried to eliminate Concordia Hospital's Emergency Room in 2017, Jim launched the 2- year plus **KeepConcordiaERopen Campaign**, giving voice to Northeast Winnipeg residents' opposition. As a result of the overwhelming public opposition to the ER closure, the PC Government backed off total closure, but still downgraded the ER to an Urgent Care.

Jim will continue the fight to get our ER back so Concordia Hospital's Centre of Excellence for Joint Surgery can once again perform complex joint surgeries.

On Seniors Issues & Home Care

Personal Care Home Bed Failures

Jim has spoken out on the failures of the PC Government to live up to their promised 1,200 new personal care home beds. Since 2016, they raised fees by up to **\$1,600** and **cut \$2 million over two years prior to 2020. They even cut funding during the pandemic.**

Home Care Failures

Instead of investing in home care positions, the PC Government handed **\$15 million** in contracts to 'for profit' home care companies without evidence these contracts delivered value or quality.

On Public Safety

Home & Business Security Protection Rebates

Jim introduced the idea of **Home & Business Security Protection Rebates** to the Manitoba Legislature.

Everyone deserves to feel safe in their homes and it's time for the Province to work with the City and other Manitoba municipalities on a province-wide rebate program to help those who need it most, **with two approved exterior security cameras, two exterior lights, and two GPS vehicle trackers.**

It would be open to residents, businesses, religious institutions and non-profit organizations and renters just like in cities like Chicago and Washington D.C..

Jim also introduced Catalytic Converter Theft legislation targeting organized crime that the Provincial Government later adopted.

Public safety is a multi-dimensional issue and more needs to be done by all three levels of government.

Here in Manitoba, an NDP government would implement recommendations on bail reform that were made by the National Police Federation, advocate for changes at the federal level, and introduce policy changes to limit gang activity in jails.
